



Requirement for Students to Receive Juris Doctor Degree

Students at Charleston School of Law, in addition to fulfilling all academic requirements for graduation, must pay all tuition and required fees in full to receive a diploma or degree. Students who have not paid their tuition and fees by the last date to change course schedules may be dropped from classes. Additionally, students' failure to pay other debts to the Law School, including those owed to auxiliary agencies, can result in their diploma or degree not being conferred.

- **Tuition and Fees:**

All tuition and mandatory fees must be paid by the due date, unless other arrangements have been made and approved by Charleston School of Law.

- **Due Date:**

The due date for tuition and fees is the last date to change course schedules, as indicated in the Law School's calendar.

- **Consequences of Non-Payment:**

Failure to pay can result in students being dropped from classes and prevented from receiving a diploma or degree. If the student is experiencing circumstances beyond their control that impact his/her ability to pay tuition and fees, the student may request a payment plan or means to satisfy their obligation upon request and required approvals from Charleston School of Law.

Any other outstanding debts to the law school or its auxiliary agencies must also be settled by the due date
